Singing for Pleasure



Singing for Pleasure began in May 2002 when one lady came into the Centre and

asked for a singing group. Since that day it has grown from strength to strength and has had

an ongoing waiting list for several years. *They even boast of appearing on national TV.*

Spin offs from Singing

As a result of the successful concerts, £122K funding was secured to install a stage, bleacher seating, lighting and sound. The theatre is well used with many 'home grown shows' celebrations, and conference events using the equipment on a regular basis. **This is money very well spent!**



Singing goes across the city and beyond

Singing for Pleasure has had a major effect on the overall work of the centre and beyond. The group often participate in other events and promotes the Centre across the city. They perform at a home grown concert each year which has sold

in excess of 600 tickets for the show. This has brought people from near and far across the city to Merkinch Community Centre. They also visit many Nursing Homes and Older people's groups to entertain and encourage others to sing along as

well, promoting health and well being to others. Singing for Pleasure won a National Award with Age Scotland as being the **Best Member Group of the Year in 2014**






