Knitting for Charity

Merkinch Community Centre started a 'Knitting for Charity' group as part of the 'Golden Times' project in 2013. People wanted to knit and natter, but also do something useful for the community. Carr Gomm charity has a shop in the Victorian Market and said they would sell baby clothes if the knitters would like to knit the garments. Lots of wool is donated (although the knitters themselves buy wool too.....) and they get together every Monday morning to knit and show off their latest creations.

To date they have raised £10,047 for the charity and pictured below receiving an award certificate for all their efforts. The knitting group have also knitted for Special Care Baby Unit and also 'Rescue Teddies' for Police.

The organisation [Knit for Peace](#) carried out a widespread literature review looking at the health benefits of the traditional craft after receiving testimonials from their 15,000 volunteers about how the hobby had improved their lives. They discovered that knitting is as relaxing as yoga, distracts from chronic pain, such as arthritis, boosts wellbeing, brings down blood pressure and keeps the mind sharp.

It also reduces loneliness and isolation and allows people to feel as if they are still useful to society.
